

Teaching Intentions	<p>Students will learn</p> <p>About right and wrong, fair or unfair</p> <p>About certain things that are right and wrong fair or unfair</p> <p>How knowing right from wrong can help us make decisions</p> <p>Why it is important to know right from wrong and fair from unfair.</p>
Starter	<p>Discuss learning intentions</p> <p>Right or Wrong quiz- discuss each scenario and get students to decide in their opinion which is right or wrong and why.</p>
Main Session	<p>Discuss what can happen if someone does something wrong.</p> <p>Fair or Unfair quiz</p> <p>Discuss what is fair or unfair and why students feel this way.</p> <p>Discuss the consequences of fair or unfair treatment and how it may make them feel.</p> <p>Student handout-Di Lemma goes to the shops</p>
