


## Di Lemma goes Christmas Shopping

Next, they tried to find the man who was selling the DVDs; they looked around the shopping area but could not see him. Di Lemma asked a policeman nearby if he had seen him; the policeman told Di Lemma that the DVD seller had committed a criminal offence by selling the DVDs. The policeman said it was also very unlikely that Di Lemma would be able to get his money back, but if the man was seen selling them again he would be arrested.

**Why do you think the DVD seller would be arrested? What are the problems with buying DVDs from someone selling them out of a bag on the street?**
