Main Session	<p>Discuss what can happen if someone does something wrong.          Fair or Unfair quiz          Discuss what is fair or unfair and why students feel this way.          Discuss the consequences of fair or unfair treatment and how it may make them feel.          Role play          Student handout-Di Lemma goes to Jake's birthday party</p>
